Local Area Research of Great East Japan Earthquake Related Marine Driftage

Press Release

JEAN (Japan environmental Action Network) to head research for Great East Japan earthquake and tsunami related marine driftage in British Columbia, Canada and Washington State of the U.S. This research is conducted by JEAN who is coordinator of Japan's ICC (International Coastal Cleanup), and is supported by the Japanese Ministry of Environment (MoE). Please inform relevant organizations/ media outlets about this event.

1. Objective

- To prepare for the arrival of large volume tsunami and earthquake related marine driftage, conduct a follow-up survey trip to North America utilizing the relationship built during the visit to the state of Oregon in 2012 for the same research purpose.
- Conduct local area research by dispatching members of Japanese NGOs concurrently with the ICC effort held every September.
- Focus research on the coastal areas of British Columbia, Canada where the research team could not visit last year.
- Build relations and collaborate with Canada and U.S based NGOs to receive information on possible large tsunami driftage arrival with the aim of informing the Japanese people with up-to-date tsunami disaster related environmental problems/ news.

2. Content

- 1. Inspect the beaches and look for driftage materials that may be from the 2011 earthquake and tsunami.
- 2. Inspect and compare the amount and variety of driftage collected in 2011 with ones collected between 2012 and this year.
- Conduct hearing meetings with NGOs, state government officials, Japanese-Canadian groups involved on the status and issues concerning tsunami driftage.
- 4. Discuss and come up with measures among the NGOs of Canada U.S and Japan on how to effectively and swiftly handle the driftage problem collaboratively.
- 5. Collection of tsunami driftage with collaboration and support from local NGOs.
